Course Overview:

The Aerowood Aviation Ground School is designed to provide students with all the knowledge necessary for their Private Pilot checkride at Aerowood Aviation. While students always have the option for one-on-one instruction with the instructor of their choosing, the Aerowood Aviation Ground School provides standardization, consistency, and community for students working through their Private Pilot. Consisting of 13 lessons, students will have exposure to all the ground knowledge subjects required for their Private Pilot checkride, have hands-on workshops/seminars, and interact with their peers at Aerowood Aviation.




Tuesday/Saturday Schedule Structure:

This course has two sessions that run on a two-week staggered plan. The Tuesday session starts on 11/18 and the Saturday session starts on 12/13. This allows for flexibility and the opportunity for makeup sessions. In the schedule, there are two columns, one for Tuesdays and one for Saturdays. The dates correlate to the lesson in the same row. For example, Lesson 4: Weather and Weather Products will be held on 12/16 for the Tuesday session and on 1/10 for the Saturday session. For those who cannot attend the 12/16 lesson, they have the opportunity to attend the 1/10 lesson.

Sporty's TCO:

All Aerowood students will be training using the Sporty's Private Pilot TCO (Training Course Outline). The lessons taught in this course correlate to the Sporty's TCO. For example, Lesson 2: Airport Ops correlates with Lesson 3 in the Sporty's TCO. The Sporty's TCO can be found on the Sporty's website portal under "Training Resources"





Course Billing:

Ground school will be billed on a per session basis. As with flight training, you only pay for the sessions you attend. Each 2 - 2.5 hour session will cost a flat fee of \$50.

However, you have the option to pay for all 13 lessons as a discounted lump sum of \$600. With this option, you will have access to all 13 lessons. If a session is missed and a makeup session is required, it is covered under the lump sum. However, if a session is attended twice (say you need extra help with Airspace and want to attend both the Tuesday and Saturday session), then the standard \$50 rate will be charged for the additional session as a one-off payment. Any sessions that are not attended will not be deducted from the lump sum or reimbursed. If you have any questions about this, please contact Mark or Hannah.
